(b) To qualify for a certificate, an applicant shall be an individual who:

(1) Is of good moral character;

(2) Is at least 18 years old;

(3) (I) After January 1, 2002, has satisfactorily completed at least 60 credit hours of education at an institution of higher education as defined in § 10-101 of the Education Article and:
