

(vii) in Baltimore City:

1. for any date when 1, 2, or 3 properties are sold, an amount not to exceed \$10;
2. for any date when 4 or more properties are sold, \$3 for each property sold; and
3. in an electronic sale, an amount not to exceed \$10 for each property sold; and

(viii) in Carroll County, the amount set by the Carroll County Commissioners.

~~SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2005.~~

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all of the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.

CHAPTER 384

(House Bill 575)

AN ACT concerning

Environment – Statewide Computer Recycling Pilot Program

FOR the purpose of authorizing a county to address methods for the separate collection and recycling of computers in a certain recycling plan; requiring certain reductions in a county's solid waste stream attributable to the implementation of certain methods to count towards certain required reductions; establishing the Statewide Computer Recycling Pilot Program in the Department of the Environment; requiring the Office of Recycling in the Department of the Environment to administer the Program; authorizing requiring, on or after a certain date, dates, certain computer manufacturers to submit to the Department a certain environmental compliance plan; requiring the Department, upon certain determinations, to certify and renew the certification of a manufacturer's plan; establishing a State Computer Recycling fee; requiring, on or before a certain date, the Department to establish the fee in regulation; requiring, on or after a certain date, retailers to collect the fee on the sale of certain computers; providing for the administration of the fee; establishing the Statewide Computer Recycling Fund to support the development of computer recycling systems throughout the State registration and fee; establishing a computer manufacturer registration fee; requiring the
