- (3) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE MARYLAND PUBLIC ART INITIATIVE PROGRAM.
 - (B) THERE IS A MARYLAND COMMISSION ON PUBLIC ART.
- (C) (1) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF 11 MEMBERS, 4 OF WHOM ARE INSTITUTIONAL MEMBERS AND 7 OF WHOM ARE PUBLIC MEMBERS.
 - (2) THE INSTITUTIONAL MEMBERS ARE:
- (I) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE STATE ARTS COUNCIL OR A MEMBER OF THE STATE ARTS COUNCIL;
- (II) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE HISTORICAL TRUST OR A MEMBER OF THE HISTORICAL TRUST;
- (III) THE STATE ARCHIVIST OR A MEMBER OF THE STATE COMMISSION ON ARTISTIC PROPERTY; AND
 - (IV) THE COMPTROLLER, OR THE COMPTROLLER'S DESIGNEE.
