determines that the total number of vehicles assigned is not warranted. vehicles shall be declared as surplus. MTA shall provide the budget committees with a report on this initiative that includes the official mileage of each vehicle in the MTA fleet, the vehicles identified as surplus, the dollar amount associated with the surplus vehicles, and MTA's plan for reassigning or declaring as surplus vehicles in its fleet to create more efficiency. MTA shall submit a report by June 30, 2005.
