- (ii) Has successfully completed the Administration approved basic motorcycle safety course.
  - (2) The Administration may:
- (i) Examine the applicant's driving as provided in  $\S$  16–110 of this subtitle; or
- (ii) Issue a provisional license, if appropriate, under § 16-111(e) of this subtitle
- (3) An individual who never held a driver's license issued by the Administration or by another state, but who otherwise may obtain a license under paragraph (1)(i) of this subsection without first obtaining a learner's instructional permit, shall successfully complete a 3-hour alcohol and drug education program established by the Administration under § 16–212.1 of this title before qualifying for a driver's license.
- (g) An individual holding a learner's instructional permit issued under this section may not drive or attempt to drive a motor vehicle on any highway in this State in violation of any of the provisions of this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2005.

## CHAPTER 454

(Senate Bill 2)

AN ACT concerning

## Municipal Corporations - Special Taxing Districts - Public Safety

FOR the purpose of authorizing municipal corporations <u>in the State</u> to create within their <u>respective</u> corporate limits special taxing districts for the purpose of financing certain capital and operating costs to enhance police, fire protection, and rescue services; authorizing municipal corporations <u>in the State</u> to fix, impose, and collect certain taxes and issue bonds or other obligations for certain purposes; and generally relating to <u>authorizing</u> <u>authorization for</u> municipal corporations <u>in the State</u> to create special taxing districts to enhance police and <u>fire protection</u> for <u>certain purposes</u>.
