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**CHAPTER 3**

**(House Bill 514)**

AN ACT concerning

**International Trade Agreement – Procurement Rules – General Assembly Approval**

FOR the purpose of prohibiting State officials, including the Governor, from binding the State or consenting to bind the State to the government procurement rules of an international trade agreement except under certain circumstances; authorizing the Governor to bind the State or to consent to bind the State to the government procurement rules of an international trade agreement only if the General Assembly enacts certain legislation; providing that certain consent that a State official, including the Governor, has given for the State to be bound to certain government procurement rules of any international trade agreements on or before a certain date is declared invalid and that the State is not bound by the government procurement rules of certain international trade agreements; defining a certain term; providing that a copy of this Act be forwarded to certain individuals; and generally relating to the authorization needed to bind the State or to consent to bind the State to certain government procurement rules of an international trade agreement.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article – State Government**

3–308.

(A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, “INTERNATIONAL TRADE AGREEMENT” MEANS A TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AND A FOREIGN COUNTRY TO WHICH THE STATE, AT THE REQUEST OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, IS A PARTY.
