- (1) the name of the applicant;
- (2) the proposed location of the child care center;
- (3) the name of the individual to be in charge of the child care center; and
 - (4) any other information that the Department requires.

- (a) Subject to the hearing requirements of this section, the Department may deny a license or letter of compliance to any applicant or deny approval for a change under § 5–577 of this subtitle if the applicant or proposed change does not meet the requirements of this subtitle.
- (b) Subject to the hearing requirements of this section and § 5-581 of this subtitle, the [Secretary] STATE SUPERINTENDENT may suspend or revoke a license or letter of compliance if the licensee:
- (1) violates a provision of this Part VII of this subtitle or any rule or regulation adopted under it; or
- (2) does not meet the current requirements for a new license or letter of compliance.
- (c) (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (d) of this section, before any action is taken under this section, the [Secretary] STATE SUPERINTENDENT shall give the individual against whom the action is contemplated an opportunity for a public hearing before the [Secretary] STATE SUPERINTENDENT.
- (2) The hearing notice to be given to the individual shall be sent at least 10 days before the hearing.
 - (3) The individual may be represented at the hearing by counsel.
- (d) (1) (i) The [Secretary] STATE SUPERINTENDENT may suspend the license or letter of compliance to operate a child care center on an emergency basis when the [Secretary] STATE SUPERINTENDENT determines that this action is required to protect the health, safety, or welfare of a child in the child care center.
- (ii) When the [Secretary] STATE SUPERINTENDENT suspends a license or letter of compliance on an emergency basis, the [Secretary] STATE SUPERINTENDENT shall deliver written notice of the suspension to the licensee stating the regulatory basis for the suspension.
- (2) (i) Upon delivery of the emergency suspension notice, the licensee or letter holder shall cease operation of the child care center within 72 hours.
- (ii) The emergency suspension shall be stayed if the licensee or letter holder requests in writing, and within 72 hours of delivery of the notice, a hearing before the [Secretary] STATE SUPERINTENDENT.
