- (5) a representative of the Department of Disabilities, appointed by the Secretary of Disabilities;
- (6) a representative of the Vital Statistics Administration, appointed by the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene; and
 - (7) the following members appointed by the Governor:
- (i) one health care provider with special expertise in autoimmune disease;
- (ii) one representative of a health care clinic that serves people with autoimmune disease;
- (iii) one representative from a State hospital that serves people with autoimmune disease;
- (iv) one representative from a State university conducting research on autoimmune disease;
- (v) one representative who is a consumer of autoimmune disease services and has expertise in autoimmune disease affecting minorities;
- (vi) one representative who is a consumer of autoimmune disease services and has expertise in autoimmune disease affecting women of childbearing age;
- (vii) one representative who is a health care consumer and a family member or caretaker of an adult with an autoimmune disease;
- (viii) one representative who is a health care consumer and a family member or caretaker of a child with an autoimmune disease;
- (ix) one representative of a patient advocacy organization that represents people with a specific autoimmune disease;
- (x) one representative of an advocacy organization that represents people with pain associated with autoimmune disease; and
- (xi) one representative of an advocacy organization that represents people with mental health issues related to health problems.
- (c) The members of the Task Force shall elect the chair from among the members of the Task Force.
- (d) The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall provide staff for the Task Force.
 - (e) A member of the Task Force:
 - (1) may not receive compensation; but
- (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
