

**Article - Commercial Law**

17-311.

(a) (1) Within [180] 365 days from the filing of the report required by § 17-310 of this subtitle, the administrator shall cause notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in the State within which is located the last known address of any person to be named in the notice.

(2) If an address is not listed or if the address is outside the State, the notice shall be published in the county within which the person who held the abandoned property has the principal place of business in this State.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2005.

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**CHAPTER 37**

**(House Bill 216)**

AN ACT concerning

**State Athletic Commission - Hepatitis C Testing Requirement for Boxers and Kick Boxers**

FOR the purpose of requiring ~~boxers and kick boxers~~ an applicant for a license to participate in a contest as a boxer or kick boxer to submit to the State Athletic Commission certain evidence of certain results of a blood tests test for virus hepatitis C at certain times; requiring an individual licensed to participate in a contest as a boxer or kick boxer to submit, as directed by the Commission, certain evidence of the results of a blood test for virus hepatitis C; and generally relating to the licensing of boxers and kick boxers.
