(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subtitle or Title 10, Subtitle 1 of this article, the Code of Maryland Regulations and the Register may not include news material or a press release, speech, or other comment.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act shall take effect October 1, 2005. It shall remain effective until the taking effect of Section 2 of this Act. If Section 2 of this Act takes effect, Section 1 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 2006, the effective date of Section 2 of Chapter 515 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2004. If the effective date of Section 2 of Chapter 515 is amended, Section 2 of this Act shall take effect on the taking effect of Section 2 of Chapter 515.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisions of Sections 3 and 4 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 2005. Approved April 12, 2005.

### (House Bill 1429)

## AN ACT concerning

# Carroll County - Highways - Prohibition on Use for Solicitation

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from standing in a roadway, median divider, or intersection in Carroll County to solicit money or donations from the occupant of a vehicle; and generally relating to restrictions on the use of highways for solicitation in Carroll County.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

# **Article - Transportation**

21-507.

(c) In CARROLL COUNTY, Charles County, Frederick County, Harford County, and Washington County, a person may not stand in a roadway, median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations of any kind from the occupant of a vehicle.
