

BALTIMORE, December 5th, 1864.

To His Excellency, GOVERNOR BRADFORD:

SIR:—At the request of Mrs. Streeter, Mr. John A. Needles and myself examined the books and accounts of the late S. F. Streeter, in reference to the Maryland Military Relief Agency.

Enclosed please find statement from May 6th to July 29th, these charges appear to us strictly chargeable to the Agency, although we find that he has spent much more for the benefit of our Soldiers; I received a communication from you to day, and immediately wrote to Surgeon General Barnes, and no doubt he will be transferred to Baltimore, if his case is as he represented. Mr. Hamilton came up from City Point this morning for supplies; getting them together for him to return, has delayed me until to-morrow morning.

We find the prospect is very good to furnish our men in the field with a sumptuous dinner on Christmas day.
