To report.

SEC. 6. The Director shall on or before the 15th day of October of each year, report to the State Superintendent in such form as he may prescribe, the condition of all the Schools under his care, embodying abstracts from the reports of District Commissioners, suggesting such improvements in the School system as he may deem useful, and giving such other information in regard to public instruction as may be of public interest.

He shall also report the number of private Schools, Academies and Colleges in the County or City, their course of study, number of pupils, male and female, and all other information in such form as the State Superintendent may prescribe, so as to present a full view of their educational facilities. A copy of this report shall be deposited in the office of the City or County Clerk, who shall safely keep it.

Salary, &c.

SEC. 7. The annual salary of the School Director in the City of Baltimore shall be determined by the Mayor and City Council, to be paid by the City Register, he performing such duties and making such reports in addition to those required in this Act as the Mayor and City Council may determine.

The annual salary of each County Director shall be determined by the State Board of Education and paid by the County Commissioners, as other County Officers are paid.

CHAPTER V.—DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS.

When, and by whom appointed.

SECTION 1. On the first Monday in June, 1865, the State Board of Education shall appoint, to hold office four years, such number of School Commissioners in each County as the State Superintendent may direct. Each Commissioner shall
