

town, the Agricultural College in Prince George County and the Baltimore Female College, are continued until otherwise ordered by the General Assembly, subject to the condition that they shall afford tuition in all the branches taught, and use of books free of charge to one student for every hundred dollars that such College receives from the State; shall report annually to the State Superintendent in such form as may be ordered by the Board of Education, and comply with all the other requirements of Article 84, of the Code entitled "Schools, and of their respective charters."

SEC. 2. The sum of three thousand dollars shall on warrant of the Comptroller be paid annually by the Treasurer to the Faculty of Arts and Sciences of the University of Maryland situate in Baltimore for the support of the College Department, said faculty to afford tuition in all branches taught and use of books free of charge, to one student for every hundred dollars received from the State. Donations to Faculty of Arts and Sciences.

SEC. 3. The Faculty of Arts and Sciences of the University of Maryland shall report annually to the State Superintendent according to such form as may be ordered by the State Board of Education, and comply with all other requirements of Article eighty-four of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Schools," as they apply to colleges. To report.

SEC. 4. St. John's College, Annapolis; Washington College, Chestertown; the Maryland Agricultural College, Prince George's County; and the Faculty of Arts and Sciences, with the School of Medicine in Baltimore, and the Law School,\* University.
