

to subscribe to such Educational Journals as he may consider valuable, to be kept on file in his office or in the Normal School for the use of Teachers. The expense of such subscriptions shall be included among the incidental expenses of the office, but not to exceed fifty dollars per annum.

Books of reference.

SEC. 2. He will also keep for reference by Teachers and those interested in Public Instruction, the rare and valuable works on Education, which by Section 10, of Chapter III. Title I. of this Act he is authorized to purchase.

Educational Museum.

These Books and Journals, together with such Text-Books and School Apparatus, Maps, Charts and Diagrams as may be sent to him from time to time, and all other objects of value, as being aids and encouragements to Universal Education, shall form an Educational Museum, to be enlarged by private benefaction or public appropriation.

## TITLE VIII.—MISCELLANEOUS.

### CHAPTER I.—COLORED SCHOOLS.

When to be established.

SECTION 1. The Board of School Commissioners for each County, and for the City of Baltimore shall establish separate Schools for the instruction of children and youth of African descent, between the ages of six and twenty-one years, whenever as many as twenty-five pupils claim the privilege of public instruction.

Under whose control.

SEC. 2. Such Schools shall be under the control of the District Commissioners and be supported and governed in the same manner, and in all respects be equal to the Schools designed for the education of other children, and be subject in every particular to the same rules and regu-
