REPORT,

To the Stockholders for the Year Ending 30th September, 1864.

To the Stockholders of the Annapolis and Elk Ridge Railroad Company. The President and Directors thereof, in compliance with the provisions of the charter submit their Annual Report, ended on the 30th day of September, 1864, as follows, viz:

The revenue of the company for the year, actually received, has been, from passengers, freight, Adams' Express company, transportation of U. S. Mails, rent of Junction house, sale of wood and from all other sources, - - - - -	\$70,901 35
To which add balance on hand 1st October, 1863, - - - - -	10,352 03
To cash in the hands of the Secretary as office change, - - - - -	200 00
And the total during the year amounts to, - - - - -	<u>\$81,453 38</u>
The disbursements during the same period have been, for salaries of President, Secretary, Treasurer and Superintendent and for wages of conductors, enginemen and other employees of the road, road bed, for gas, wood sawing, cutting wood, coal, cross ties, spikes and chairs, castings, carpenters wages, working passenger and freight trains, U. S. Internal revenue tax, hauling wood, contingent and incidental expenses, insurance, and for day and night watchmen, &c., - - -	\$38,987 94
For amount paid J. M. Tyng, for new locomotive, - - - - -	15,000 00
For amount paid O. Miller, for wharf lot, - - - - -	887 75
For amount paid Geo. Wells, for this sum advanced by him and paid to Murphy & Allison, for a new baggage and passenger car, - - -	2,200 00
