Cross-examination.

Question. How long had that company of Horse Guards been organized?

Answer. It might have been six months, or perhaps a year. Question. Was it organized under the militia laws of the State of Maryland?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Did you belong to any military organization?

Answer. Yes. The Towson Guards.

Question. About the 19th or 20th of April were any members of the Towson Guards out in uniform?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Were you out?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Were you under arms?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Was your company drilling?

Answer. No, we used to go out at night and see what was going on. We watched them and they watched us.

Question. Did you see Mr. Grason with the company when

they went to Baltimore?

Answer. I am not sure, I can't say positively. Question. Did Mr. Grason return with them?

Answer. I did not see them when they returned, they returned in the night.

Question. Did you at any time subsequent to that see Mr.

Grason with the company?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Drilling the company?

Answer. No. I don't think he ever drilled the company. Question. Were you present at the parlor of Ady's Hotel at any time when Capt. Ridgely and Mr. Grason were there? Answer. No.

Question. Did you ever at any time see them in the parlor

together?

Answer. We were passing backward and forward and we saw them come out together and we supposed they went in together.

Question. Was that the public parlor of the house?

Answer. I suppose so.

Question. Was it the parlor for the reception of parties

who stopped at the hotel?

Answer. Generally when ladies came they went in there, when gentlemen came they were accommodated at the other end of the house.

Question. How long did the flag remain on the top of the
