

Question. In what direction did they move?

Question. Where is Hopkins Hunt now?

Answer. He is either with the Confederate army or in Canada.

Question. Do you know whether the United States flag was taken down at that time?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Do you know whether Mr. Grason was present at the time?

Answer. He was out in the yard between Mr. Ady's and the flag pole.

Question. Do you know whether he had any agency in taking down the flag?

Answer. I do not think he had, because some one of our men appealed to Mr. Grason about it coming down, and Mr. Grason made use of the remark that he would have nothing to do with it.

Question. Did you see the flag, that you say was over Ady's Hotel, before it was put up?

Answer. Yes.

Question. In whose charge was it?

Answer. In charge of Harry Gilmore, Richard and Edwin Hook.

Question. Were they members of the Horse Guard?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Were they officers or privates?

Answer. I declare I don't know. They were not commissioned officers.

Question. Did you see the company have any other men in custody besides those you have spoken of?

Answer. Yes. I saw them bring another man down the road.
