Question by the Committee. Did the company make any reconnoissance.

Auswer. I don't know that they made any reconoissance.

Direct examination resumed.

Question. After returning to Cockeysville, how long did you remain?

Answer. I was at Mr. Merryman's, I suppose a week.

Question. How long did these Pennsylvania troops remain at Cockeysville, or in that vicinity?

Answer. They went away, I think on Tuesday.

Question. In what direction?

Answer. They went back up the railroad.

Question. After their retirement, were any railroad bridges destroyed?

Answer. Yes. After they returned some railroad bridges were destroyed.

Question. By what forces was that done?

Answer. By the Baltimore County Horse Guards, and some persons living in the neighborhood.

Question. Were these members of the company that lived

up in the direction of Cockeysville?

Answer. One of the Lieutenants lives not a great ways

above Cockeysville.

Question. Do you know whether either before going to Baltimore or afterwards, orders were received for the company from either Commander Trimble or Col. Kane?

Answer. No.

Question. Do you know whether any arms were received by the company at Towsontown, other than their ordinary pistols and sabres?

Answer. They received some rifles.

Question. Do you know from whom they received them? Answer. No.

Question. State, if you know, what was done with these rifles?

Answer. Nearly every member had one; each member received one, as far they held out.

Question. Do you know for what purpose these rifles were given?

Answer. I suppose for the purpose of shooting with.

Question. To shoot at whom?

Answer. I do not know.. I did not calculate upon shooting any body.

Question. How long was that organization of the Horse

Guards kept up?

Answer. I don't know exactly. I think they were organized in February, and drilled once a week, until, I think, the excitement about the 19th of April;
