Question. Where were you standing?

Answer in the vicinity of Ady's Hotel most of the time.

Question. On the porch of Ady's?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Was there any difficulty occurred on the porch while you were there between any parties?

Answer. I think there was, between Mr. Yellott and his

nephew, I think it was.

Question. Did that difficulty occur whilst you were there?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Do you recollect who were present at Ady's Hotel?

Answer. Mr. Ady, Mr. Payne and his son John; Mr. Wm.

Thompson and Mr. Yellott.

Question. Who did he have the difficulty with?

Answer. His nephew.

Question. Was Mr. Grason there at that time?

Answer. No; I did not see him.

Question. How long were you there?

Answer. Some five (5) or six (6) hours, I suppose; I left igust before night.

Question. Was there any other disturbance except what

you have spoken of?

Answer. Not to my knowledge.

Question. Was there any cheering, groaning, or hissing?

Answer. No.

Question. Do you mean for the Committee to understand that the only noise you heard was the difficulty between those two (2) parties?

Answer. That was all I heard and saw. Question. Did that amount to a fight?

Answer. No; only loud words.

Question. Would you not have seen Mr. Grason, if he had been there?

Answer. I almost certainly would.

Question. Were any of the Baltimore County Horse Guards there, in uniform, on that occasion?

Answer. I don't think there was; I did not see any.

Question. Do you know the fact, whether or not, prior to that time, they had ceased to act?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Do you know at what time they ceased?

Answer. I think towards the latter part of the week before; this was on Monday, and I think they ceased to act and to appear in uniform on Thursday of the week before.

The examination in chief of this witness was here concluded.

Cross-examination.

Question. Were you a member of the Horse Guards?
Answer. Yes.
