Answer. The company was deputized by the Sheriff.
Question. Was that the case with the company of Towson
Guards?

Answer. To the best of my recollection it was. I had a printed notice given me by the Sheriff.

By the Committee.

Question by the Committee. What time was that?

Answer. About the 19th of April.

Question by the Committee. Were those two companies on friendly terms?

Answer. Yes. I went into the armory where they were,

and they came to the Hotel where we were.

Question by the Committee. Where was your Head Quarters?

Answer. Ady's Hotel; one of the rooms of the Hotel.

Question by the Committee. Which room?

Answer. Mr. Ady's parlor.

Cross-examination resumed.

Question. Who was the Sheriff?
Answer. Francis J. Wheeler.

By the Committee.

Question by the Committee. Do you pretend to say that

the Sheriff deputized you to go to Baltimore city?

Answer. I don't know anything about that; he deputized me to preserve peace and order; that was about the terms of the note.

Cross-examination resumed.

Question. Was that order given to the members of your company?

Answer. I suppose the others got them.

Question. Do you know whether any other members got them?

Answer. I don't know; I suppose so.

Question. You cannot fix the time when you got it, can you?

Answer. No. Question. Do you know anything about the burning of the bridges?

Answer. No.
