Question. Did Mr. Kone ever call to see you in reference

to that matter of the taking off his hat?

Answer. Not until he came home last Friday night; he was talking about it, and asked if I remembered it. First, I told him I did, after I studied over it, I told him I could not remember anything of the kind.

Question. Was that the first conversation on that subject?

Answer. Yes.

Question. You did not see Mr. Grason on that occasion? Answer. No.

The examination in chief of this witness was here concluded.

Cross-examination.

Question. You say you were at the bottom of the flag-staff, were there many persons at Ady's Hotel?

Answer. That I could not tell you, I did not take notice

of it.

Question. Can you name any persons that you saw over at Ady's Hotel, at that time?

Answer. No. I cannot name any.

Question. Do you remember having heard any acclamations, hurras, hisses, or groans, or demonstrations of any kind, at Ady's Hotel during those proceedings?

Answer. No.

Question. Did that flag run up to its place without any difficulty?

Answer. There was a catch I think, when it was part way

up.

Question. Did you hear any groaning at that time?

Answer. No.

Question. Was there any cheering at any time during the proceedings?

Answer. There was cheering given for the flag.

Question. Were you present at more than one flag raising during that spring?

Answer. I was present at both.

Question. How long after the first flag raising before the second took place?

Answer. It was some six (6) or eight (8) weeks.

Question. How long had this flag been suppressed before you run it up?

Answer. Some week or ten (10) days more or less.

Question. Had you had any other flag, standard or banner flying in Towsontown during that time?

Answer. Nothing that I remember particularly.

Question. Nothing at Ady's Hotel?

Answer. I think there was some kind of flag flying from Mr. Ady's Hotel. I don't remember what it was.
