Answer. I suppose I could, if I had been looking there. There was very few at the house at that time.

*Question by the Committee.* Did you pass by Ady's to go to the pole?

Answer. Yes. I did not see Mr. Grason there.

*Question by the Committee.* What do you mean by the second time, the 29th?

Answer. After the raising of the 29th I cannot tell exactly how long.

*Cross-examination by Contestant.*

Question. Can you undertake to specify all the persons who were present at Ady's porch at either of these flag raisings?

Answer. I could not specify all. I believe I could if it had not been so long a time, some were there I was not very well acquainted with.

Question. Was your attention directed chiefly to those about Ady's or at the flag?

Answer. Ady's.

Question. What attracted your attention to them rather than to the flag raising?

Answer. Because there was a little fuss kicked up over there.

Question. Did that last during all the time of the flag raising?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Was that at both times?

Answer. Second time.
