Question by the Committee. Was there any intimidation on the part of the gentlemen in that vicinity on the 29th of April?

Answer. I don't think there was any fear of molestation at the time; I think there was an idea that if the ladies put it

up it would be more likely to stay up.

Question by the Committee. The gentlemen had not courage

enough and the ladies had?

Answer. It was intended that the ladies should have all the honor of putting the flag up, and the gentlemen, of course, stood back, it was the ladies doing, putting up the flag at that time.

Question by the Committee. Did it appear to be the general impression in Towsontown that it would be safer for the la-

dies to do it than the gentlemen?

Answer. The gentlemen gave it "aid and comfort;" I think it was about the time the ladies "Relief Association" was formed, and the ladies took it in hand; Mrs. Sheeley, Mrs. Thompson and the ladies who took a particular part in the formation of that society. dolph Hidgely, her nephew.
