Cross-examination.

Question. You have spoken of this flag-raising of the 29th of April; that you do not remember having seen Mr. Grason there at that time—do you remember whether you had seenMr. Grason about there a few days previous to that?

Answer. Really, I cannot say.

Question. In the interval, between the 19th of April and that day, did you see anything of a company known as the Horse Guards?

Answer. Yes; I had seen considerable of them.

Question. Had you seen Mr. Grason in company with them?

Answer. Yes; he was a Lieutenant of the company.

Question. Were they under arms?
Answer. They were, for a time.

Question. Do you remember the circumstance of their going to town?

Answer. I was in town all that day—the 20th. Question. Did you see Mr. Grason in town?

Answer. Yes.

Question. In company with whom?

Answer. John Merryman.

Question. What hour of the day was that?

Answer. About the middle of the day. I was coming down North street, and saw them in a buggy; they turned down towards Holliday, about Woodward's stables.

Question. Were they going towards Towsontown or from it?

Answer. They would be going towards Towsontown.

Question. Did you observe whether they came out of the street that runs right from Holliday street near the Police headquarters?

Answer. I did not see them come into North street.

Question. How long was that before the Horse Guards went into town?

Answer. I should say that was the middle of the day; the omnibus started at 4 o'clock, and when I got five (5) miles from the city, I met the company coming in under arms.

Question. Was Mr. Grason with them at the time you met

the company going in?

Answer. Yes; I believe so.

Question. Can you name any persons that you saw about, in the vicinity of Ady's porch, or in the road near the porch, at the time of the flag-raising?

Answer. Not now.

Question. Can you name any incidents that transpired at Ady's porch, or in the vicinity, at that time?

Answer. No; I don't remember.
