Question. Were you taken before Col. Woolley and examined?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Upon what charge?

Answer. I was charged with having guided the rebels. Qustion. What was the result of that examination?

Answer. I was released until called for.

Question. On your return from Col. Woolley's office did you pass through Towsontown?

Answer. No.

Question. Where were you when the raiders came into Towsontown?

Answer. In Towsontown.

Question. Had you been taken prisoner?

Answer. Yes, by Major Gilmor, at Magnolia. Before we got to the Harford road, a little boy that we met told Gilmor there was cavalry at Bishop's. Major Gilmore was then riding with me in the buggy, and leading his horse; he told me to get out of the way, I considered that I was discharged. I then went over to Mr. Bishop's and asked him if I could get to the city, he told me if I got in I could not get out any more, it was then after night. I stood there about twenty (20) minutes, in this time Major Gilmor came up with his army. Question. What was that business?

Question. Did you know the party of whom you inquired the way?

Answer. No.

Question. Did you walk along with him some distance?

Question. Did Mr. Grason give the reason why your case had not been tried?
