*Question by the Committee.* As you participated in it, I thought perhaps you had some knowledge on the subject?

Answer. I had no motive: I put it up because it was there.

*Cross-examination.*

Question. You were a member of the Horse Guards?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Did you go to Baltimore with them?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Was it after that company went to Baltimore that flag was put up?

Answer. Yes, I think it was.
