Question by the Committee. Was there any apprehension of any trouble between the citizens of Baltimore and the citizens of the county?

Answer. I don't know; there was no telling what might

take place.

Question by the Committee. Then you had no instructions to

watch the troops stationed near Cockeysville?

Answer. No; I had not when I was sent out there.

Cross-examination resumed.

Question. Did you have one of those orders to act as deputy sheriff?

Answer. I don't think I had; I was acting under general principles; I was in the employ of the Sheriff, at the time; I may have had one; I don't remember; I have not got it now.

By the Committee.

Question by the Committee. Where did you say the Sheriff was now?

Answer. I think at Martinsburg; I understood he was act-

ing as agent for Adams' Express Company.

Question by the Committee. Do you remember how many times you drilled after the company returned from Baltimore? Answer. No; I never took any memorandum of any drills

or parades.

Question by the Committee. Did the company drill at all, after its return from Baltimore?

Answer. I can't say that it did.

Question by the Committee. Did they ever meet again, as a

company, after their return from Baltimore?

Answer. I think they met together after that; I cannot recollect the day; I don't know whether I was out on parade after that; I think the company was convened together once after that.

Question by the Committee. Did you say you were present on the 29th of April, when the flag was raised by the ladies?

Answer. I think I was; I have a faint recollection of being in the road; I think I came from the office at the time the flag was being taken out; there were two (2) flags hoisted, I think; I don't know which I saw.

Cross-examination resumed.

Question. Where were you during the time the flag was being raised?

Answer. 1 think I was in the road, when the flag was raised; I am not sure. I might have been at Ady's Hotel.
