*Question by the Committee.* Do you know whether any of these military who took part in burning the bridges were men of different political views?

Answer. I don't know what their views were; the party that was with General Trimble belonged to the Maryland Guard.

*Cross-examination resumed.*

*Question.* Did you see General Trimble subsequent to that in the city?

Answer. Yes.

*Question.* Was he rendering any sort of military service, if so, what?

Answer. I don't know whether it was military service or not; he appeared to be very busy distributing arms about to parties; I do not know who they were.

*Question.* State what knowledge you have of his location now, or any time since then?

Answer. He has been down South, what he is doing, I cannot say.

*Direct examination resumed.*

Answer. Do you know of any parties who were engaged in the destruction of those bridges, that have since held high office in the army of the United States?

Answer. None that I know.

*Question by the Committee.* Do you know of any who have since joined the army of the United States?

Answer. None that I saw engaged in the destruction of the bridges.

*Question by the Committee.* Do you know anything of the destruction of the bridges on the Northern Central Railroad?

Answer. I only know of those on the Philadelphia road.
