Answer. Quite likely.

*Question by the Committee.* Did you hear Mr. E. Louis Lowe's speech on that occasion?

Answer. I think the only speeches made there that day, were made by Brown, Preston, Wallace, McLane, and the Governor.

*Question by the Committee.* Do you remember the display of the State flag by any one in the rear of the platform?

Answer. I do not remember seeing but this one State flag.

*Question by the Committee.* Do you remember that flag, and the character of the remarks made by the speaker, upon the display of that flag?

Answer. I do not remember.

*Cross-examination resumed.*

Question. Do you remember ever having seen that flag raised, before that week?

Answer. I cannot particularize when I have seen it, but my impression is that I have frequently seen the State flag flying.

*The examination of this witness was here concluded.*
