*Question by the Committee.* Did the steamboat land at Queenstown?

Answer. Yes.

*Direct examination resumed.*

Question. Had his father been ill at that time?

Answer. I think he had been sick before that.

Question. Do you know how long he remained on that visit to his father?

Answer. I do not; as well as I recollect he remained a week.

Question. How far from Mr. Grason's house was the landing?

Answer. Three miles or three miles and a half.

*The examination in chief of this witness was here concluded.*

*Cross-examination.*

Question. At the time you met Mr. Grason in the summer of sixty-one had you heard of the battle of Bull Run before you met him?

Answer. No.

Question. Did you hear of it while you were together?

Answer. No.

Question. When did you first hear of it?

Answer. Two or three hours afterwards.

Question. How often did the boat come from Baltimore?

Answer. Twice a day, when there is two boats running.

Question. How do you fix this day as being Monday or Tuesday of the week?

Answer. Because I remember it was the very day I heard of the Battle of Bull Run, which was fought on Sunday, and we heard the news on Tuesday afterwards. I remember perfectly well it was the day I heard of the battle.

Question. Did you hear of the result of the battle, or merely that there had been a battle?

Answer. I saw a Baltimore paper three hours afterwards, telling the result of the battle.

*Question by the Committee.* Do you mean to say that it might have been on Monday that you saw Mr. Grason?

Answer. Either Monday or Tuesday, it was not later than Tuesday.
