

GEORGE L. BRYAN, called as a witness for the Respondent being duly sworn, testified as follow:

Question. State your name, residence and business?

Answer. My name is George L. Bryan, I reside on Wye River, about eight miles from Queenstown and am a farmer.

Question. Are you acquainted with Mr. Grason?

Answer. Yes. I have known him twenty years, I am well acquainted with his family.

Question. Do you recollect seeing him about the time of the first battle of Bull Run in 1861?

Answer. Yes.

Question. State all the circumstances connected with it?

Answer. I saw him on Saturday before the fight on Sunday, I rode from Queenstown with his brother and saw him the Tuesday following at my house.

Question. Did you see him after that?

Answer. Well, I cannot be positive. I saw him at his mothers funeral.

Question. When was that?

Answer. That was about the last of July, she died on 29th of July I think, and was burried on the 31st of July.

Question. You saw him then on Wednesday did you?

Answer. Yes.

Question. What time of the day did you see him on Wednesday the 31st?

Answer. Between ten and twelve o'clock in the morning.

Question. Did you see him after that?

Answer. No I am not positive, I was at his father's house both before and after and at the time of the services.

Question. Did you see him after his mother had been buried?

Answer. Yes.

Question. What time was it when you left there?

Answer. Between one and two o'clock he was then there.

Question. What time does the boat leave Queenstown to come to Baltimore?

Answer. That season of the year she leaves not earlier than twelve or one o'clock.

Question. Do you recollect whether the boat left on that day or not?

Answer. I do not?

Question. You do not remember how long he remained after his mother's funeral?

Answer. No. I could not say.

Question. Where did you see him last after his mother's funeral?

Answer. I could not be positive about that.

Question. Where were you on Sunday the day of the battle of Bull Run?

Answer. At my house.
