Answer. Yes; it had been taken down on Sunday. I think it was down when I returned, the only recollection I have of a flag after that is seeing it when I came to Towsontown.

Question. Was there any other flag flying at that time

from Ady's Hotel?

Answer. I think there was, I do not know what it was, I took but little part in the excitement.

Question. Were you a member of any military organiza-

tion?

Answer. I had attached myself to the Baltimore County Horse Guards, but I never drilled with them, nor was I ever at any of their meetings. When I came to town I found so much excitement, that my impression was that mankind had gone crazy.

Question. Who else was present at this conversation in the

Court House?

Answer. I think Mr. Carman was also present.

Question. Were you then and since, and are you now a Union man?

Answer. I have always called myself so. I recognize the Constitution as the land mark. When I came to Towsontown, I found every body was in a state of excitement, every body there was at sea, in fact crazy, there was certainly a mania of some kind produced by this excitement; I told them so, there were Union men, have always been, those were the men who were there under this excitement, who now condemn me for advocating the policy which I advocated then.

I had no gun on my shoulder on that day, or any other day, but I saw a great many who had, whom I talked with on that day, who to-day differ very much with me in senti-

ment though I don't think I have changed at all.

By the Committee.

Question by the Committee. Have you ever been arrested by the authorities of the United States for disloyalty?

Answer. No.

Question by the Committee. Have you been charged with any acts of disloyalty?

Answer. No. I never heard any charges against me.

The examination of this witness was here concluded.

CALEB S. TAYLOR, called as a witness for the Respondent, being duly sworn, testified as follow:

Question. State your name and residence.

Answer. My name is Caleb S. Taylor, I reside in Baltimore county, near Towsontown.

Question. Where did you reside in the month of April,

1861.
