Guards?

Answer. I don't know, I did not visit among them.

Question. You do not know that there was any claim at all that the Horse Guards were loyal?

Answer, Not much the beginning of this trial.

Answer. I never heard of it.

By the Committee.

Question by the Committee. Do you know whether any members of your company wore badges?

Answer. Yes; I heard they wore the State flag the coat-of-

arms.

Question by the Committee. Did you regard that as disloyal?

Answer. I hardly knew what was disloyal at that time,

there was so much excitement.

Question by the Committee. In speaking of the State flag, do you mean that it was the Maryland flag?

Answer. Yes; the Maryland coat-of-arms.

(The Maryland coat of arms was here shown to the witness, and he was asked by the committee, whether that was the flag which he alluded to.)

Answer. That was the flag which I saw.

Question by the Committee. Did your company have the Stars and Stripes?

Answer. Yes; we had a new one that we always kept in

the Hall.

Question by the Committee. Did you ever see the Horse

Guards with the Stars and Stripes?

Answer. I never saw them with any flag at all from the time they were organized.
