EDWARD H. ADY, called as a witness for the Respondent, being duly sworn, testified as follows:

Question. State your name, residence and business?

Answer. My name is Edward H. Ady; I reside at Towson-town, and keep a hotel there.

Question. Were you present at either of the flag-raisings

spoken of?

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Answer. Yes; I was at home both times that they were raised.

Question. Do you recollect of any difficulty having occur-

red between George Yellott and other parties?
Answer. Yes; that was at the last time; the difficulty

took place between Mr. George Yellott and his nephew Tip. Question. Was there any difficulty between any other parties at that time?

Answer. No; not particularly; a good many persons came up to my house at the time the difficulty occurred, but I do not think there were any blows struck between the parties.

Question. Was Mr. Grason there at the time?

Answer. I did not see him; I was in the house at the first flag-raising.

Question. Do you recollect when that occurred?

Answer. I do not recollect the date exactly.

Question. Was Mr. Grason present at that time?

Answer. I don't recollect so much who were present that time.

Question. How many were at your place the first time?

Answer. Very few; five (5) or six (6) persons.

Question. Do you recollect any difficulty occurring at that time?

Answer. No; I do not.

Question. Do you recollect any groaning, hissing, or cheer-

ing?

Answer. The first time I ever heard of it was since this trial commenced; there certainly was nothing of the kind about my house when I was at home, or I would have stopped it.

Question. Do you know anything about the raising of a flag over your house?
