Answer. No, I never did.

9.30 o'clock A. M.

The Committee met, present all the members.

WILLIAM GRASON, called as a witness for the Respondent, being duly sworn testified as follows:

Question. State your name and age?

Answer. My name is William Grason, I am 15 years old.

Question. Are you the son of Richard Grason?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Did you go to the Eastern Shore with your father in the Summer of 1861?

Answer. Yes.

Question. About what time did you go?

Answer. In July.

Question. Had you a sister born about that time?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Do you know when she was born?

Answer. No, I do not recollect the date.

Question. How long did you remain on the Eastern Shore?

Answer. About three (3) weeks I think.

Question. At your grandfather's?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Did your grandmother die while you were there?

Answer. Yes.

Question. How long after she was buried was it before you returned?

Answer. About a week I think.

Question. Do you recollect anything about the battle of Bull Run?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Where were you when that took place?

Answer. At my grandfather's.

Question. Was your father there with you?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Do you recollect hearing any noise from that battle?

Answer. Yes, the guns I suppose.
