no favoritism whatever, and would as well find a bill against Judge Grason as any other man, although the Judge and I have been intimate friends for a long while; but as regards politics, we were always adverse.

## Direct examination resumed.

Question. Were you or not directed by Judge Grason to be governed by Mr. Ensor's advice, with reference to those questions of law?

Answer. He told us we ought to be governed by Mr. Ensor.

The Examination of this witness was here concluded.

POWELL GRISCOM, called as a witness for the Respondent, being duly sworn, tesfied as follow:

Question. State your name, age and residence?

Answer. My name is Powell -Griscom; I am 51 years old; and I live at Texas, Baltimore county.

Question. Were you a member of the Grand Jury at the last session of the Circuit Court of Baltimore county?

Answer. Yes.

Question. Do you know Wm. J. Thompson, a witness who was examined in this case?

Answer. I cannot remember him. Question. Was he before you?

Answer. There was a gentleman of that name before the Grand Jury.

Question. Was he a witness in matters relating to Judge Grason?

Answer. He was.

Question. Was he questioned in reference to Judge Grason's presence at any flag raising at Towsontown?

Answer. Yes.

Question. State what his testimony was in reference to that subject?

Answer. His testimony was, that he did not see Mr. Grason there; if he had been there, he thought certainly he would have seen him.

Question. Was he questioned in relation to any cheering

or hurraing by Mr. Grason?

Answer. I don't know that he was; he would have been, if he had not have stated that he did not see Judge Grason there.

Question. Were there any other questions put to him in

reference to Judge Grason?

Answer. I don't remember all the questions that were asked the witness at that session of the Grand Jury, in reference to these treason and perjury cases; I know they were
