Question. Did you discuss this particular point—the charge against him?

Answer. I have never had reference to it to this day.

Question. There was certainly some charges brought against him to the grand jury, did the Judge know that?

Answer. Not that I know of; if he did, I was not aware

of it.

Question by the Committee. Had you any conversation with

the Judge in regard to this matter at his house?

Answer. Not upon that matter before the grand jury; our conversation was upon general topics that everybody was talking about.

Question by the Committee. Was your object in calling upon

him to get any points out of the Judge?

Answer. No; It was not; that is a thing I would not do

with any man.

Question. Did the Judge make any reference to that proceeding of the grand jury?

Answer. Not the least.

## Direct examination resumed.

Question. Was the office of Judge Grason in his house? Answer. Yes.

## Cross-examination resumed.

Question. Did Judge Grason keep a law office at that time?

Answer. It was an office; whether he used it as a law office, I cannot say; it was the office he used before he was Judge.

Question. Was your conversation in the office or house? Answer. Once in the office; the other times in the parlor.

## By the Committee

Question by the Committee. Have you not always been a Union man?

Answer. Yes; I have always been from the beginning; I have never scratched a name off the Union ticket.

## Cross-examination.

Question. Has Judge Grason been a Union man? Answer. I cannot tell.

Question. You have been very familiar with him, have you not?
