

Question. Did you discuss this particular point—the charge against him?

*Question by the Committee.* Was your object in calling upon him to get any points out of the Judge?

Answer. No; It was not; that is a thing I would not do with any man.

Question. Did the Judge make any reference to that proceeding of the grand jury?

Answer. Not the least.

*Direct examination resumed.*

Question. Was the office of Judge Grason in his house?

Answer. Yes.

*Cross-examination resumed.*

Question. Did Judge Grason keep a law office at that time?

Answer. It was an office; whether he used it as a law office, I cannot say; it was the office he used before he was Judge.

Question. Was your conversation in the office or house?

Answer. Once in the office; the other times in the parlor.
