Mr. Wilson presented three petitions from the Commissioners and citizens of Harford county, against a turnpike road from Churchville to Aberdeen;

Which was read and referred to the Harford county delegation.

Mr. Wooden presented a petition from Joseph Ebaugh and other citizens of Carroll county, praying the General Assembly to pass a General Law for the re-assessment of all taxable property in this State;

Which was read and referred to the Select committee already appointed on the subject.

Mr. Rinehart presented two petitions from citizens of Frederick county, against the passage of an Act taxing the citizens of Frederick county to pay the rebel contribution;

Which was read and referred to the Frederick county delegation.

Mr. Smith, of Frederick presented a petition from Henry Baker and eighteen other persons against levying a tax upon the citizens of Frederick county to pay for contributions levied upon said city by the rebel army, in July last;

Which was read and referred to the Frederick county delegation.

Mr. Comegys presented a petition from Wm. B. Turbet, James E. Thomas and others, citizens of Kent county, praying for the passage of a law to increase the fees of Justices of the Peace and Constables and to increase the jurisdiction of the former;

Which was read and referred to committee on Judiciary.

Mr. Agnew, presented a memorial from George A. Ohler and others of Frederick county, praying the repeal of the charter of the Westminster and Taneytown Turnpike or Plank Road Company;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. Darling, presented a memorial from Charles H. Bradford of Baltimore city, Inspector of Guano, praying relief from the General Assembly;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Claims.
