Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Rider, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to repeal sections 139, 140, 141, 142, 143, 144, 145, 146, 147 and 148 of the Code of Public Local Laws for Somerset county, relating to retailers ;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Miller, of Anne Arundel, from a Select committee reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to amend and re-enact sections 55 and 58, of Article second of the Code of Public Local Laws relating to the sale of spirituous liquors to minors and persons of color in the city of Annapolis;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Harris, from a Select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act for the regulation of hackney carriages in the city of Baltimore;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Markey, from a Select committee reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 310, of Article 11, of the Code of Public Local Laws entitled, Frederick county, and to re-enact the same with amendments;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Willis, from a Select committee reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to appropriate a sum of money sufficient to procure a full length portrait of the late Governor Thomas Holliday Hicks, to be placed in the Executive Chamber of Maryland, and a further sum to erect a monument over the remains whenever he may be finally interred;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Lee, of Baltimore city, from a Select committee reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to enable the Baltimore United Fire Department to donate its properties and effects to the Aged Men's Home, of Baltimore city, and to dissolve its organization and surrender its charter;

Mr. Robinson, from a Select committee reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to make valid the action of Charles R. Stewart as commissioner to divide the real estate of Nicholas Forrester, late of Anne Arundel county;
