Ordered, That the committee on Ways and Means, be instructed to report a bill authorizing the County Commissioners of the several counties, and the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore city, to increase the per diem of Jurors in their respective courts.

On motion of Mr. Lee, of Queen Anne's,

Ordered, That it be entered upon the Journal, that John C. Tolson, of Queen Anne's county, is absent from his seat on account of sickness.

On motion of Mr. Lee, of Baltimore city,

Ordered, That the State Librarian be, and is hereby ordered to furnish the Code from those on hand in the Library.

Mr. Kirk submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the respective delegations from the counties and the city of Baltimore, be authorized to furnish all the Justices of the Peace with bound copies of the New Constitution;

On motion of Mr. Miller, of Anne Arundel,

The consideration of the order was postponed until to-morrow.

On motion of Mr. McCauley,

Ordered, That the Speaker appoint a committee of five to proceed at once to take up the New Constitution, and go regularly through it, referring all the matters therein requiring legislative enactment, to their appropriate committees, and then proceed in like manner with the Governor's message;

The Speaker appointed Messrs. McCauley, Rinehart, Smith, of Allegany, Miller, of Anne Arundel, and Chew, said committee.

Mr. Poteet moved to reconsider the order adopted on Tuesday last, requiring "that whenever it is necessary for this House to pass an order for extra stationery, the articles needed should be specified in the order;
