Mr. Jones, submitted the following amendments :

Amend the bill by adding the following sections, to be known as sections 2 and 3 :

Section 2. And be it enacted that the Commissioners of the said village of Greensborough, shall have full power to assess all taxable property within the limits of said village, levy and collect taxes for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of the original Act, to which this is a supplement, and in accordance to this supplement :

Section 3. And be it enacted, that the commissioners of said village shall have power and authority to grade and pave the sidewalks of the village of Greensborough ; and the money collected by taxation or otherwise, in pursuance to the original Act, to which this is a supplement, and in pursuance to this supplement, shall be used for grading, paving and other necessary expenses in carrying out the provisions of the original Act and the supplements thereto ;

Amend section 2 by making it section "4 ;"
