Mr. Pennington, from a Select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act supplementary to the Act of 1864, chapter 353, entitled, an Act to incorporate the President and Commissioners of the town of Cecilton ;

Which was read the first time.

The resolution submitted on the 14th instant, by Mr. Valiant, requesting the Governor to release all persons now suffering incarceration in the penitentiary for enticing slaves to run away, was taken up.

On motion of Mr. Tull,

The consideration of said resolution was postponed informally.

The resolutions submitted by Mr. Watkins on the 10th instant, in relation to compensation for emancipation,

Were taken up for consideration on its second reading.

Mr. Watkins submitted the following amendment:

And that said committee be authorized to represent said interest before the next Congress of the United States;

Which was decided in the affirmative.

Mr. Slothower moved that the said resolutions be referred to the committee on Federal Relations.
