A message was received from the Executive by John M. Carter, Private Secretary, enclosing the returns of election for Judge of the Circuit Court of Baltimore county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Elections.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the joint resolutions relating to a subscription by the State to the publication of the English Statutes in force in Maryland, according to the report of the late Chancellor Kelley, to the Legislature;

Which were read the first time and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Joint resolutions authorizing the Librarian to subscribe for two hundred copies of Cohen & Lee's Digest of the Decisions of the Court of Appeals;

Which were read the first time and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.

Also, the following Senate bills:

A bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 210 of article 10, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to Dorchester county, and to enact a substitute therefor;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Dorchester county delegation ;

A bill entitled, a supplement to an Act passed at January session, 1853, chapter 246, entitled, an Act to incorporate the Potomac Mining company;

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Corporations.

A bill entitled, an Act to repeal article 80 of the Code of Public General Laws, and the several sections thereof, and re-enacting the same with amendments;

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the Judiciary.
