

An Act to incorporate Freedom Lodge, No. 112, of Ancient, Free and Accepted Masons.

An Act to incorporate the Hopewell Mining company;

Which were read the first time.

Also, reported back to the House the bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the town of Templeville, in Caroline and Queen Anne's counties;

Which was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Anderson, from the committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably the bill entitled, an Act to authorize the State's Attornies for Carroll and Frederick counties to institute proceedings to forfeit the charter of the President, Directors and Managers of the Westminster and Taneytown Turnpike company;

Mr. Lusby, from the committee on Agriculture, reported favorably the bill entitled, an Act appropriating the interest to be realized from the sale of the scrip donated by the United States to the State of Maryland for the benefit of Agriculture, by the Act of Congress, approved second session, 1864, and to amend the charter of the Maryland Agricultural College, by adding additional members to the Board of Trustees;
