Said resolutions were then returned to the Senate.

Also, reported favorably the following joint resolution:

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian be and he is hereby authorized and directed to subscribe in the name of the State, for two hundred and fifty copies of the Digest of the Decisions construing the Statutes of Maryland, of which the Code of Public General Laws is composed, with specifications of the Acts of Assembly by Charles F. Mayer and Lewis Mayer:

Provided, the price thereof, shall not exceed five dollars per copy, and the Librarian is further directed to distribute the same number of copies of said Digest and in the same way as the copies of the Maryland Reports are now authorized by law to be distributed, and the residue to sell or exchange for such other books as may be required in the State Library; provided, nevertheless, that he shall retain thirty-five copies in the Library for the use thereof;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Poteet, from the committee on Claims, reported favorably an Act to compensate Richard C. Hardesty, administrator of Geo. W. Sherwood, deceased, late Clerk of the Circuit Court for Baltimore city, for completing the records of said court which were left unfinished by William H. Turner, former clerk of said court;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Jones, from the committee on Corporations, reported favorably the following bills:

An Act to incorporate the Swann Meadows Iron and Manufacturing company;

A supplement to an Act entitled, an Act to incorporate the Baltimore, Catonsville and Ellicott's Mills Passenger Railway company;

An Act to incorporate the Maryland Life Insurance company;

Which were read the first time.

The vote by which the Senate amendment to the bill amendatory of the charter of the Western Maryland Railway company was adopted was reconsidered.
