

The question being upon concurring in the Senate amendment;

It was decided in the negative.

Mr. Miller, of Washington county, from a Select committee, reported favorably an Act to amend the 13th section of the Act incorporating a company to make a turnpike road from Williamsport and Hagerstown, passed March 2d, 1833, chapter 125;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Stone, from a Select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to amend section 31 of the 9th article of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, in relation to the Circuit Court of Charles county;

Which was read the first time.

The bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 199 of article 19, of the Code of Public Local Laws relating to Somerset county entitled, "Sheriff," and in lieu thereof insert the following:

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to make valid the action of Charles R. Stewart as Commissioner to divide the real estate of Nicholas Forrester, late of Anne Arundel county,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal section 310 of Article 11 of the Code of Public Local Laws entitled, Frederick county, and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Was read the third time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to amend and re-enact sections 55 and 58 of Article 2 of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the sale of spirituous liquors to minors and persons of color in the city of Annapolis,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Smith, of Frederick,

The House took up for consideration the bill entitled, an Act to create and incorporate the Monocacy and Rockville Turnpike company.

Said bill being on its second reading,
