

EVENING SESSION.

The House met at half-past seven, P. M.

Present at the call of the roll the following members :

Mr. Willis moved that the rules be suspended, in order that the Militia bill might be taken up for consideration on its third reading ;

Which was decided in the negative.

The bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Grant Coal and Coal Oil and Lumber Company of Allegany county,

Was taken up for consideration upon its second reading.

Mr. Smith, of Allegany, submitted the following amendment:

Amend section 2, line 17, by inserting the word "rate" after the word "same ;"

Which was decided in the affirmative.

The bill having been read the second time, was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act for the regulation of Hackney Carriages in the city of Baltimore,

Was taken up for consideration on its second reading.

Mr. Cummins submitted the following amendment:

Amend section 1. Strike out in lines 24 and 25 the words "either in black or yellow on a white ground, or in white or yellow on a black ground;"

Which was decided in the affirmative.

Mr. Pilkington submitted the following amendment:

Section 2, line 19, strike out "ten" and insert "twenty;"

Which was decided in the affirmative.
