

The Speaker having sealed the ballot-box, and inscribed the same as follows:

“Ballots of the House of Delegates of Maryland, for State Librarian, Police Commissioner and Directors for Banks in which the State is interested, Annapolis, March 7th, 1865. This box contains sixty ballots.

Delivered it into the hands of Messrs. Tull and Rider, who conveyed it to the Senate, and after some delay returned and submitted the following

REPORT :

The tellers, Messrs. Tull and Rider, on the part of the House of Delegates, conjointly with Messrs. Ohr and Stephenson, on the part of the Senate, appointed to receive and count the ballots cast for State Librarian, Police Commissioners of Baltimore city, and Bank Directors, most respectfully beg leave to report that they have discharged their duty, and find that there were seventy-five ballots cast, of which H. P. Jordan received sixty-eight votes for State Librarian ; Samuel Hindes received for Police Commissioner, fifty-six votes; Peregrine Groome, for Director in the Easton Bank, received fifty-two votes ; W. B. Massey received for the same fifty-two votes.

Directors in the Mechanics Bank:—Henry Janes received forty-seven votes, and George R. Berry received forty-seven votes, and George Small received two votes.

Directors in the Bank of Baltimore:—Samuel Duer, received 50 votes.

Directors in the Farmers Bank of Maryland:—H. D. Woodward received fifty-eight votes, and John Reichard received three votes.

Directors in Hagerstown Bank:—John Reichard received forty-eight votes and Henry Landis received fifty-one votes.

Benjamin Fawcett and Timothy Twist received each one vote for State Librarian.
