Said bill was then sent to the Senate.

Mr. Anderson, from the committee on the Judiciary, reported back to the House unfavorably the bill entitled, an Act appropriating a sum of money to compensate the Bailiffs of Baltimore city for the collection of taxes in arrears in said city due the State of Maryland for the years 1862, 1863 and 1864.

Pending the second reading of the bill, it was referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Soper, from the committee on Ways and Means, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to repeal sections 3, 5, 8, and 9, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the Officers of the Maryland Penitentiary, and to re-enact said sections 5 and 8 with amendments;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Anderson, from the committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably the Senate bill entitled, an Act to repeal the 81st section of article 7 of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the Sheriff of Caroline county, as amended by chapter 351, passed January session, 1864, and to re-enact the same with amendments;

Which was read the second time.

Also, reported back to the House unfavorably the bill entitled, an Act to authorize the Register of Wills of Worcester county, in the recess of the Orphans' Court of said county, to pass any account or claim against the estate of a deceased person for any amount not exceeding one hundred dollars, and on the return of any inventory of a deceased person to pass an order for a sale of the property contained therein.

Mr. King moved that the enacting clause of the bill be stricken out;

Which was decided in the affirmative.
